How to enrol

- Check the PC catchment area.
 Families wishing to enrol at Picnic Creek SS must reside within our school catchment. See the school website for further information. Evidence of residential address is required upon enrolment.
- Collect enrolment pack from our school office.
- Complete application for student enrolment form and gather all required documents.
- Submit application.

Required documents

- Your child's birth certificate or passport.
 Children must be 5 by 30 June in the year they enrol.
- Two (2) proofs of residential address.
 Accepted documents are:
 One primary source current Rates Notice in enrolling parents' name or current Rental Lease Agreement valid until at least March of the student's enrolling year
 One secondary source a utility bill (e.g. electricity, gas), showing this same address and parent's/legal guardian's name
- Information about your child's medical condition, medications and relevant reports.
- Details of any relevant Family Court orders or other court orders.

- Attend an approved kindergarten program. Kindergarten programs are planned to develop children's skills, knowledge and understandings which support their continued learning.
- Sign the Transition Statement consent form at your kindy in October/November. This document assists greatly in supporting each child's successful transition to school.
